

# Stage 5 Grammar notes (II) - plural nouns

Copy down the following examples:

## singular:

puella ridet. → The girl is smiling.

servus ambulat. → The slave is walking.

mercator contendit. → The merchant is hurrying.

## plural:

puellae rident. → The girls are smiling.

servi ambulat. → The slaves are walking.

mercatores contendunt. → The merchants are hurrying.

> Each of the underlined nouns are in the nominative case. It refers to a person / persons who are performing an action.

• nominative singular: puella, servus, mercator

• nominative plural: puellae, servi, mercatores

Nominative plurals are also patterns that are part of the declension chart.
